Our Relationships: Love One Another as the Body of Christ

Romans 12:9-21 / June 29, 2019

And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?"

Jesus answered, "The most important is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.'

The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

And the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher. You have truly said that he is one, and there is no other besides him. And to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is much more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."

And when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And after that no one dared to ask him any more questions. (Mark 12:28-34)

AGAPE GENUINE LOVE (12:9a)

Let love be **genuine**. (9a) "Without hypocrisy"

Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples,

- (1) "The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat, so do and observe whatever they tell you, but not the works they do. For they preach, but do not practice. (2) They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to move them with their finger. (3) They do all their deeds to be seen by others. For they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long, and they love the place of honor at feasts and the best seats in the synagogues and greetings in the marketplaces and being called rabbi by others.
- (1) But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all brothers. (2) And call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven. (3) Neither be called instructors, for you have one instructor, the Christ.

The greatest among you shall be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted.

- 1. "But woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you shut the kingdom of heaven in people's faces. For you neither enter yourselves nor allow those who would enter to go in.
- 2. Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you travel across sea and land to make a single proselyte, and when he becomes a proselyte, you make him twice as much a child of hell as yourselves.
- 3. "Woe to you, blind guides, who say, 'If anyone swears by the temple, it is nothing, but if anyone swears by the gold of the temple, he is bound by his oath.' You blind fools! For which is greater, the gold or the temple that has made the gold sacred? And you say, 'If anyone swears by the altar, it is nothing, but if anyone swears by the gift that is on the altar, he is bound by his oath.' You blind men! For which is greater, the gift or the altar that makes the gift sacred? So whoever swears by the altar swears by it and by everything on it. And whoever swears by the temple swears by it and by him who dwells in it. And whoever swears by heaven swears by the throne of God and by him who sits upon it.
- 4. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others. You blind guides, straining out a gnat and swallowing a camel!
- 5. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you clean the outside of the cup and the plate, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence. You blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and the plate, that the outside also may be clean.
- 6. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs, which outwardly appear beautiful, but within are full of dead people's bones and all uncleanness. So you also outwardly appear righteous to others, but within you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness.
- 7. "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you build the tombs of the prophets and decorate the monuments of the righteous, saying, 'If we had lived in the days of our fathers, we would not have taken part with them in shedding the blood of the prophets.' Thus you witness against yourselves that you are sons of those who murdered the prophets. Fill up, then, the measure of your fathers. You serpents, you brood of vipers, how are you to escape being sentenced to hell? Therefore I send you prophets and wise men and scribes, some of whom you will kill and crucify, and some you will flog in your synagogues and persecute from town to town, so that on you may come all the righteous blood shed on earth, from the blood of righteous Abel to the blood of Zechariah the son of Barachiah, whom you murdered between the sanctuary and the altar. Truly, I say to you, all these things will come upon this generation.

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you desolate. For I tell you, you will not see me again, until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.'" (Matthew 23:13-39)

1. DESPISES EVIL AND CLINGS TO GOOD (12:9b)

• **Abhor** what is evil; "Loathing" "The thought of having a drunken fool as a son-in-law"

• hold fast to what is good. (9b) "Dust clinging to the feet" "Uniting with someone in a sexual relationship"

2. HONORS EACH OTHER AS FAMILY (12:10)

• Love one another with brotherly affection. (10a) "Nurturing love that parents have for their children" "Affection and nurture shown to siblings or children"

• Outdo one another in showing honor. (10b) "Lead forth" "Esteem"

3. REQUIRES FOCUS, PASSION, SERVICE, JOY, STUBBORNNESS, AND ENDURANCE (12:11-12)

• Do not be **slothful** in **zeal**, "Lazy" "Enthusiasm"

• **be fervent** in spirit, "Boiling, bubbling, or fermenting"

• **serve** the Lord. (11)

Rejoice in hope, "Grace"

• be **patient** in tribulation, "Stubbornness"

• be **constant** in prayer. (12) "Obstinacy"

4. REQUIRES PRACTICAL EXPRESSIONS OF TIME AND MONEY (12: 13)

• Contribute to the needs of the saints (13a) "Deep involvement and participation in the lives of others"

• and seek to show **hospitality**. (13b) "love of strangers" "Protecting and caring for the traveler or stranger"

5. BLESSES NON-CHRISTIANS AND WALKS ALONGSIDE CHRISTIANS (12:14-15)

- Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. (14)
- Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. (15)

6. TREATS EACH OTHER AS EQUALS (12:16)

• Live in **harmony** with one another. (16a)

"Same mind" "Thinking in the same way about each other"

• Do not be **haughty**, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. (16b)

"An inappropriate pride that fails to recognize one's own failures and reliance on God's grace"

7. DOES NOT RETALIATE BUT SHOWS GOODNESS (12:17-21)

- Repay no one evil for evil, (17a)
- but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, **live peaceably** with all. (17b-18)

"To put an end to strife"

- Beloved, never avenge yourselves,
- but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." (19)

"to grant justice"

- To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." (Proverbs 25:21-22)
- Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with **good**. (20-21)
